III. Legal basis for data processing

- For persons acting on their own behalf (e.g. end customers): Art. 6 para. 1 lit b GDPR (establishment and performance of a "contractual relationship")
- For persons who represent a company (e.g. employees of a GmbH): Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR (balancing of interests)
- In the case of the advertising activites for products and services of our company, this is also done on the basis of the balancing of interests in accordance with Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR

IV. Purposes of the processing

- Processing your enquiry
- Establishment, implementation or termination of the business relationship with you or your employer
- Advertising activites for products and services of our company

V. Legitimate interests

In the case of advertising activites for products and services of our company, we contact you on the basis of Art. 6 para. 1 lit. f GDPR, because we have a legitimate interest in expanding and deepening our business relationship. We only use the contact data you provide for this purpose, taking into account legal restrictions (e.g. no newsletter without consent). You can object to this at any time. As far as the processing of your enquiry in a business relationship with your employer is concerned, we naturally also have an interest in "living" this business relationship. For this purpose, we have received your business contact details (e.g. at a fair). We may also have received your data via a third person, who forwarded your enquiry in your interest to us, our support as business partner is needed for the implementation or you gave your consent to the third person to forward the contact data. In the sense of a mutual business relationship, we deem it acceptable to use your data for the above described purposes.



VI. Data categories

We ,normally, process your business contact data that we obtained. These data are sometimes already partly supplemented by a predefined purpose (e.g. your enquiry) and thus enriched by business matters.

VII. Data sources

In most cases, we collect personal data directly from the data subject (e.g. at fairs or when you contact us). However, it is also possible that we receive your personal data via third persons (e.g. via business partners).

VIII. Recipients (-categories) of personal data

In principle, we disclose personal data only to fulfil the above mentioned purposes. If, in particular cases, data are to be disclosed to any third persons, we will have informed you of this in advance.

IX. Storage period

Generally, we assume to have an open-ended business relationship. Therefore, we store the obtained personal data in our systems. Deletion will only take place if you expressly request this or legal storage periods have expired. In particular cases, we delete information (e.g. for specific enquiries) already after the settlement of the matter.

X. Transfer to third countries

We do not transfer your personal data to non-EU member states. Should this, however, be necessary to fulfil the purpose, we will observe that security in the recipient country (e.g. like in Switzerland through an "adequacy decision" in accordance with Art. 45 GDPR) complies with the GDPR.

XI. Your rights - rights of the data subject under the GDPR

Art. 12 - 23 GDPR regulate the rights of the data subject, i.e. your rights with regard to the handling of your personal data. These are essentially vis-à-vis us:

- Right to information in accordance with Art. 15 GDPR
- Right to rectification in accordance with Art. 16 GDPR
- Right to erasure in accordance with Art. 17 GDPR
- Right to restriction of processing in accordance with Art. 18 GDPR
- Where applicable: Right to data portability pursuant to Art. 20 GDPR
- Right to object to processing in accordance with Art. 21 GDPR
- Right to lodge a complaint: According to Art. 13 para. 2 lit. d GDPR, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a data protection supervisory authority. A list of data protection officers and their contact details can be found in the following link:
